

## WILDERNESS RIFLE HUNT PERSONAL ITEMS LIST

Hunting License/Conservation Stamp
Picture ID
<b>Rifle:</b> Practice Shooting as much as possible before your hunt. If possible, site in 200 yards; be
comfortable to 500 yards.
Ammo: Three boxes are plenty. If you think you need more, spend more time at the shooting range.
Sleeping Bag & Pillow: We like the Hallo-Fill or down, rated to at least -20. We furnish cots and foam
pads. Not necessary for the ranch house hunts. *
<b>Binocular's:</b> 8 x 42 or more powerful.
Hunting Knife
Hat: For protection and warmth.
Alarm/Cell Phone/Camera (with battery pack)
Head lamp & extra batteries
Hunting Clothes
Socks: Smart Wool recommended
Toilet Kit: Include Chap-Stick, sunscreen and any medication you may need.
Gators: These work well to keep boots and pants dry
Hunting Coat, Pants and Rain gear: Gortex is best.
Sunglasses
Lighter
Liquor: We don't do any heavy drinking, but an evening drink goes well after a hard day hunting.
Orange: Hat or vest
<b>Boots:</b> 2 pairs waterproof hunting boots; wear one, pack one.
Gloves: 2 pairs waterproof.
Camp shoes: comfortable shoes to wear around camp. Slippers for ranch hunts.
Pants: Blue jeans for around camp
Long Underwear: Two pair
Plastic Bag: Handy to have for dirty clothes.
Duffle Bag: 18"x30" works best We prefer to see two 35# duffle bags rather
than one large duffel. Not needed for ranch hunts.
Towel and Wash Cloth Not needed for ranch hunts
Pen: to sign game tag in the field
Water Bottle
Game Bags: cheese cloth style; they are good and inexpensive
<b>Bear Spray:</b> This will have to be bought in Cody if you are flying; it is a forbidden substance
on a plane.
